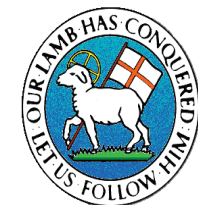

We are seeking quality candidates to assist paid staff and volunteers to accomplish the Mission Statement of Laurel Ridge as a mountain place set apart for forming disciples of Jesus Christ who live and learn in community to serve in the world through the following positions:

**M-Staff** Under the supervision of the Laurel Ridge Director, these employees work with the Facilities and Program Managers, to support the Camp Deans and volunteers (primarily at Summer Camp Facilities) through cleaning, maintenance, lawn care, program support and as a role models for campers.

**Mission Camp/Higgins Staff** Under the supervision of the Laurel Ridge Assistant Director, these employees work with the Facilities and Program Managers, to support the work of Mission Camps held at Higgins Lodge through program support, leadership of campers and volunteers in building relationships with homeowners and repairs to their properties.
