The Advent Connection

Advent Moravian Church will celebrate its 95th anniversary on June 23, 2019. I thought it would be interesting to write about some of the people connected to Advent that led to Advent's becoming a Moravian Church. The first person is Rev. Henry Shultz. According to the Friedberg Diary, the Rev. Henry Shultz, a Friedberg minister, held a preaching service at Cool Spring in Jacob Shore's schoolhouse on July 20, 1835.

The Rev. Henry Shultz was born on February 7, 1806, at Hope, a mission station of the Moravian Church in Surinam. His father was Theodore Shultz, a native of Prussia (Germany) and his mother, Elisabeth Susan Catharine Loesch, was a native of Pennsylvania. His father was president of the Mission Board of Hope. Henry was baptized by his father on February 9, 1806. During Henry's infancy, his mother carried him past a crouching tiger. The mother was in extreme terror until Henry's father and some Indians killed the tiger. Another time while the mother was nursing Henry, a serpent coiled around a mirror near them. The father killed the serpent with a sword.

In autumn of 1806 Henry's family sailed to Boston on an American ship, a voyage that took 35 days. Henry was confirmed on March 29, 1820. He entered the Seminary at Nazareth Hall in 1823 and left the seminary in 1826 to become the teacher in the Boys School in Salem, N. C. In 1833 Henry became pastor at Friedberg and in 1839 until 1842 he was assistant pastor at Salem (Home Church). On July 21, 1864 Rev. Shultz was consecrated a bishop of the Moravian Church in Bethlehem, Pa. He retired in 1871 and died on October 21, 1885 at the age of 79 years, 8 months, and 15 days never knowing that what he started at Cool Spring became Advent Moravian Church.

This information was taken from Rev. Shultz's memoir.

The job includes general office duties that are necessary to assist the minister in his pastoral ministries. These duties include receptionist to general administrative work. The job also includes maintaining the church financial records and preparing monthly financial reports for the Board of Trustees. These duties include receiving and reporting all church offerings to preparing financial reports for the board, auditor, etc. This position requires the ability to balance the daily workload as well as handle needs/concerns of the congregation. The employee in this position must have a good working relationship with the members of the congregation as well as staff members. The position is responsible to the minister and to the Executive Committee. The church administrative assistant works Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. with a lunch break of one hour. The work of the administrative assistant shall be evaluated on a yearly basis by the Executive Committee.

The requirements for this position are:

- Excellent communication skills, both written and verbal
 - Good computer skills and knowledge, including social media, website design and production and newsletter
 - Ability to use and maintain office equipment
- Prior office management and financial experience
