We collected \$105.00 to send boxes of food to the needy children of Europe. In the First Presbyterian Church, Greensboro, the pastor united in marriage Jane Faye Hodgkin, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Irvin Cheatwood Hodgkin of Guilford College, and Edgar Edward Long, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dewey Long of Advent Church. Received by adult baptism were Clarice Miller Snyder and Nancy Jane Long and by infant baptism, Terry Wayne Long.

The church band is making good progress under the direction of Rowe Whitaker, and the Boy Scout troop recently organized with T. A. Issacs, Jr. and Tom Gibson as scoutmasters is going forward successfully with 30 boys registered. Two youth choirs for juniors and intermediates have been organized with Miss Nan Davis, Griffith High School music instructor, directing. Douglas Kimel is directing the senior choir.
