## Advent Moravian Men in World War I

November 11, 2019 will mark 101 years since World War I ended. Advent Moravian had men that served during World War I. I would like to honor these men by sharing their stories of service to our country during this war. If you know of an Advent man or woman who served in World War I, let me know so I can recognize them. The first man I want to recognize is Madison Cleveland Rumley.

Madison Cleveland Rumley was born on October 23, 1892 in Guilford County. He was the son of Martin Burgess Rumley and Virginia White Rumley. Cleveland grew up in Goshen Methodist Church where he accepted Jesus as his Savior. He attended the public schools of Guilford County through most of high school. When Cleveland reached the age of twenty, he took a job with the railroad in Richmond, Virginia, where he worked for several years. On November 29, 1917 he married Bright Pegram.

Brother Rumley's life was interrupted when he was called to military service on August 5, 1918. Thirty days later Cleveland was sent to France. He remained in France until the following July when he was gassed by the Germans. This gassing would cause Cleveland much difficulty for the rest of his life.

Returning home from the war, Cleveland moved to Dunleith Avenue in Winston-Salem. At this time he worked on building the Reynolds Building. The family attended Grace Methodist Church during these years. Cleveland was blessed with a son, Herman and a daughter, Julia Rumley Snow. In 1927 Brother Rumley joined Advent Moravian Church.

As a result of being gassed, Cleveland suffered mentally beginning ten years after his return from France. However, Cleveland had large blocks of time when he was able to lead a normal life. Eventually he became disabled and was confined to the Veterans Hospital in Salisbury, North Carolina. Cleveland died on August 23, 1962 at the age of sixty-nine years and ten months at the Veterans Hospital in Salisbury.

We are grateful to Madison Cleveland Rumley for the sacrifice he made to keep our country safe.
