Jacob "Jake" Franklin Long By Suzanne Clodfelter

Jacob F. Long was born in Davidson County on April 29, 1891, the fourth of seven sons. He was born to Lebanon Avis Long (1859-1946) and Lucretia E. Sink Long (1860-1935), who were married Nov 9, 1882. He grew up in the Midway community and attended school there.

In his late teens, he moved to Chattanooga, TN with his brother W.D. Long, (William Daniel), looking for work. By age 18, he was a molder in the iron company of Cahill Iron Works, making architectural items such as arches, grates, mantles and bath fixtures. He lived with his brother and his brother's wife, Stella and niece Thelma. When W.D. moved back to North Carolina, Jacob stayed in Chattanooga.

By 1914, Jacob was an accountant at the Southern Express Company, which dealt with shipping goods and valuables, and issuing money orders. He continued there over the next three years, living as a boarder or renter in several homes in the William Street neighborhood. He was active in a Methodist church there and served as Sunday School superintendent for two years. His future wife was also living nearby on William Street, as early as 1915. In December 1917, he married Lillian B. Donnelly. Lillian was from Georgia and was a stenographer and bookkeeper all her life. (In 1937, Lillian Long died, having never remarried after the death of Jacob.)

Their marriage was short-lived, as Jacob was already in training for World War 1. In June 1917, JAKE, as he was now known, described himself on his draft card as single, tall, blue-eyed and with dark hair. He was inducted at the Reserved Officers Training at Camp Fort Oglethorpe in Georgia. This was a large training ground about nine miles from Chattanooga. It was a rapid, nine week course to supply officers for leadership on the front, something the United States was badly lacking in Europe. From Fort Oglethorpe, Jake went to Camp Gordon in Augusta, Georgia for ground training.

Jake was deployed with the 82nd Division, 325th Regiment, Company K as a Second Lieutenant. The 82nd was airborne as it is today. After more training in France, the regiment was involved in battle near St. Mihiel. They then waited for orders to be committed to the Meuse-Argonne Offensive led by General John J. Pershing. It was the largest maneuver ever fought in US history, involving 1.2 million American soldiers, lasting 47 days, from Sept 26 to Nov 11, 1918. The objective, besides to break the German line, was to capture the railway network that supplied the German Army. It is still the deadliest battle in American history, with over 350,000 casualties, including 26,277 American lives. Complicating the effort were the inexperienced soldiers as well as the deadly and widespread outbreak of the Spanish flu. However, the offensive was successful by November 6 and the German Armistice came on November 11.

According to a letter Jake wrote home, he was injured during this battle around Oct.14-16. He succumbed to his injuries on October 20, 1918. He was listed in newspapers and military records as "dying of wounds." His body was interred in Cemetery 10 at Chaumont, Haute-Marne, France in the officer's plot. Then in 1919-1920, there was outcry to move the bodies of fallen American soldiers home and families were given the choice to do so. On April 26, 1921, Jake's body was sailed home on the military transport ship USAT "Wheaton," leaving Antwerp, Belgium and arriving in Hoboken, NJ August 29. He was reinterred at the National Cemetery in Chattanooga.

Suzanne Clodfelter is Robert and Peggy Williams' daughter and great granddaughter of Jacob Long. W. D. Long is Robert Williams' grandfather and the brother of Nathan, Charles, Bob, Ira and Dewey Long. If your name is Long or you are related to the Long's you are probably related to Jacob Long.
